

"Always enter the most recent number first."

QUESTION

I'm re-reading Book 1. I have a question. On page 32 you say, "Always enter the most recent number first." What exactly does that mean when entering the numbers in the programs on your website? I've just been copying and pasting groups of numbers from my spreadsheet in no particular order. Should I copy and paste one number at a time, beginning with the most recent? So the most recent number should be the first number put into the box?

ANSWER

YES. Enter the most recent number first and work your way back.

For example, let's say someone is entering the Florida numbers last Thursday July 23 after the evening drawing. 099 hit Florida that night and 808 hit for midday. 565 hit on the night of the 22nd and 446 hit for midday that day. Before that 945 and 944 hit on Tuesday July 21. 952 and 088 hit on Monday July 20 and 304 and 323 hit on Sunday July 19.

So for July 23 you have this list (most recent first and going back):

099 808 565 446 945 944 952 088 304 323

THIS is the order you would enter them on all my programs (those that require that you enter 10 numbers). So if you are using the **Super Six** program, it would look like this:

In this particular case, 179 hit straight the next day on Friday July 24.

On the night of Friday July 24, you would enter the last 10 numbers, which are these:

179 859 099 808 565 446 945 944 952 088

Useful Tip: When you are back testing the program (going back to see how well it performed in the past) you can speed things up by entering the MOST RECENT numbers in the FRONT (179 and 859):

179 859 099 808 565 446 945 944 952 088 304 323

DO NOT enter all 10 numbers for every new drawing when back testing this or any of my other programs; just enter the most recent number or numbers in the FRONT. The program will automatically delete any number past the 10th number.

In this case the program will **automatically delete** the last two numbers (304 323) so you only have 10 numbers: 179 859 099 808 565 446 945 944 952 088

The output for these 10 numbers is this:

The number that hit after 179 was **903** and it was right there on the program. (now you see why this is one of my favorite programs!)

To get the output of the program for this new set of 10 numbers (starting from 903), you would put 903 in front of 179 (the program will automatically delete the last or 11th number; 088:

903 179 859 099 808 565 446 945 944 952 088

The output for these 10 numbers is this:

Combine the Super Six program with the Pair System
