

Back to the Drawing Board

I will have to go back to the drawing board because it is now clear that some of my assumptions about the game are wrong.

For example, playing in 7 day cycles is very costly if the system you are using is not hitting because you have to cover 7 or 14 drawings and that translates into 7 or 14 LOSSES per week if your system is not working.

So I will have to rethink my idea of playing in 7 day cycles.

This means that playing on a DRAW to DRAW basis may be better.

This means re-evaluating some of my original systems that were based on playing on a draw to draw basis. And fortunately, I am more experienced now – so I know what problems to avoid.

One of my original systems that worked pretty well on a draw to draw basis is the 3 digit Coding system. You will need to use one of the CODE programs for this. They both give you the same 3 digit code (only the playlists are different in the two programs shown below).

Good Programs

- > DTD 33
- > CODE-KEY MATCH
- > CODE-64
- > CODE-3-BASIC

A code is made up of three digits that have a VERY GOOD chance of hitting on the very NEXT drawing. The FIRST digit is the strongest.

You will have to test the program in your state to see if it works.

This program may NOT work in your state.

For example, 799 just hit New York and the last 10 NY numbers are:
799 322 322 797 540 636 773 460 590 156.

I am going to enter these numbers into the Code-3 BASIC program

Good Programs

> DTD 33
> CODE-KEY MATCH
> CODE-64
> CODE-3-BASIC

I get this output (I have the numbers in grey because they do not matter; what you are looking for is the code: 253).

(NOTE: If I keep using this system over the next few days and weeks and it works, I will explain how I am getting the code...but only to **Gold members. You can get the code with pen and paper; but you need to know the formula I am using in this program.)**

I will say that the code for 799 is 253.

I will write it like this:

799 – 253

322 hit before.

I will use the previous 10 numbers to get the code for 322.

Code-3-BASIC

10 Numbers used: 322 322 797 540 636 773 460 590 156 916

Code-293

The code for 322 is 293.

I will put this underneath:

799 – 253

322 – 293

Notice that the code “hit” because the code is 293 and 799 (TWO 9s) hit on the very next drawing. I will show this by making the 9 in code 293 red, like this.

799 – 253

322 – 293

322 hit before (two 322s hit back to back).

I will use the previous 10 numbers to get the code for 322.

Code-3-BASIC

10 Numbers used: 322 797 540 636 773 460 590 156 916 850

Code-015

The code for (THIS) 322 is 015.

I will write it underneath.

799 – 253

322 – 293

322 – 015

I will cross it off because none of the three digits in the code (0-1-5) hit.

799 – 253.

322 – 293

~~322 – 015~~

797 hit before.

I will use the previous 10 numbers to get the code for 797.

Code-3-BASIC

10 Numbers used: **797 540 636 773 460 590 156 916 850 493**

Code-045

The code for 797 is 045.

I will put 797 and code 045 underneath – but I will cross it off because none of the three digits in the code (0-4-5) hit on the next drawing.

799 – 253.

322 – 293

~~322 – 015~~

~~797 – 045~~

540 hit before.

I will use the previous 10 numbers to get the code for 540.

Code-3-BASIC

10 Numbers used: 540 636 773 460 590 156 916 850 493 065

Code-015

The code for 540 is 015.

I will add it underneath – and cross it off because none of the digits hit (0-1-5)

799 – 253.

322 – 293

~~322 – 015~~

~~797 – 045~~

~~540 – 015~~

THIS is What I am Looking for!

This is what I am looking for in this system; **3 back to back LOSSES**. None of the digits in the code hit for numbers 322, 797, and 540. This means that **the code is due** (assuming this coding system works in your state). And sure enough, the code hit on the very next drawing: the code for 322 is **293**, and the 9 hit next (as a double) in the number **799**.

799 – 253
322 – 293
322 – 015
797 – 045
540 – 015

You will have to back test this program in your state to figure out how the code “works” in your state. The way this program works in New York is that the FIRST digit in the code: **253, 293, 015**, etc. is the strongest. Many times it will hit as a double.

This means that now I am expecting a number with a 2 to hit NEXT in New York. This means the midday drawing tomorrow, Thursday October 13.

How to Get the Playlist for Any Digit or Digits

How do I get the playlist for the digit 2?
I can use either of the red programs below.

- > HIT PARADE 50
- > HIT PARADE 100
- > SUPER SIX
- > BASIC BOX
- > BASIC 52
- > DTD REFERENCE BOX
- > PAIR FREQUENCY FINDER
- > WHEELING PROGRAM
- > **120-SINGLES-ONLY**
- > **210-SINGLES/DOUBLES**
- > STRAIGHT POSITIONAL CONTROL
- > BOX POSITIONAL CONTROL
- > PAIR FREQUENCY FINDER 40
- > PAIR FREQUENCY FINDER
- > BOX-TO-STRAIGHT

Below are the two playlists from both programs.

These numbers are good for ONE drawing only.

And these are box numbers. I would play the singles if I thought that a single will hit – or the doubles if I think that a double will hit.

How to Get a Shorter Playlist

The programs below will give you a shorter playlist if you enter the digit 2 into any of them.

Digit Playlist Programs

- > MASTER LIST 140
- > DIGIT PLAYLIST 104
- > CONTROL LIST 100
- > DIGIT PLAYLIST 64
- > DIGIT PLAYLIST 80
- > DIGIT PLAYLIST 55
- > DIGIT PLAYLIST 40

For example, the [Control List 100](#) program will give you 30 numbers for the digit 2.



How I am Tracking the Numbers

I want to show you how I am tracking these numbers. Notice below that I have the numbers lined up sequentially with the most recent number up on top. I highlighted with a red marker the digit in the code that hit. For example, the 9 in 293 is in red because it hit on the very next drawing: **799.**

I crossed off the numbers when none of the digits in the code hit.

I am doing this because I am looking for 3 back to back losses or misses; that's my cue or trigger to “jump in” and start playing.

A MIRACLE!!

Did you see that?

There is a Pick 3 “miracle” on that list.

Here is a clue: what is the code for 636?

The code for 636 is 045.

Code-3-BASIC

10 Numbers used: **636** 773 460 590 156 916 850 493 065 612

Code-**045**

And what number hit right after?????

540

This will happen from time to time with this system! I would say about ONCE a month!

Now...I will do what I always do: play on paper for now.

And just to review; the basic strategy here is to first back test the program in your state to see if at least one of the three digits in the code tends to hit on the very next drawing.

If the program works, wait for 3 back to back losses.

Then play the singles or doubles for the FIRST digit in the code.

And remember to always play on paper FIRST.

Only play with real money after 5 (FIVE) paper hits.
